2 Employees of the local council dug a hole in the pavement and placed very poor fences around it. Rosie, who is blind, collided with the fences which collapsed, causing her to fall into the hole and suffer injuries. Boris, a firefighter employed by the council, was called to rescue Rosie from the hole. Due to the seriousness of Rosie's injuries Boris had to use excess force to drag her to safety, resulting in further injuries.

(a) Analyse whether Rosie can prove there was a duty of care in negligence, held by the council.

Ismail immediately called Rob, a specialist in fixing play areas, to repair the swing. As Rob entered the play area a loose piece of the swing fell on his head, causing him to be knocked out and suffer a brain injury.

The Sands Hotel was preparing for a very large wedding on Saturday. On the previous Monday, they sent an email to Dahlia's, a local florist, asking for a quote for the price of flowers for the wedding reception. Dahlia's quote arrived in the post on Tuesday, offering to supply the flowers for a price of £10,000. The Sands Hotel was asked by the florist to reply by letter to accept the offer, but the hotel immediately replied by email, 'We will pay £5500'.

Dahlia's then telephoned to state that the price was not negotiable, but it could still supply the flowers for £10,000. The florist also asked on what day delivery was required and to reply by post. The Sands Hotel replied by email 'Friday' and Dahlia's responded asking the hotel to send a letter confirming acceptance. The Sands Hotel sent a letter, posted on Tuesday night, which arrived at Dahlia's on Thursday.

However, on Wednesday, Dahlia's sent an email stating that it could not now supply the flowers on Friday. The Sands Hotel had to find another supplier for the flowers on Thursday, at a cost of £12,000.

- (c) Assess the contractual rights and remedies, if any, of The Sands Hotel against Dahlia's.

- 4 Petra worked in a call centre. She attended a union meeting to discuss health and safety, which was held in a dangerous part of the building. The manager of the call centre decided to break up the meeting.

Petra was angry about the disruption of the meeting so joined a group of workers who had blocked the entrance to the call centre. Petra's manager then warned her that she would lose her job if she continued to take part in the blockade or if she joined the union.

- (a) Identify Petra's rights under Article 11 of the Human Rights Act 1998, and whether these have been restricted.

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(b) Analyse Anton's legal obligations arising from the storage of tenants' personal data and its subsequent illegal use.

Rosa, a famous actress, had sent a sensitive letter to her father. The Moon newspaper obtained and published an extract from Rosa's letter without Rosa's permission. The extract alleged that Rosa's famous brother-in-law, Jaden, had used racist language. The Moon newspaper also planned to release a news report, on its TV channel, stating that Rosa had bullied a male employee and got him to sign a legally binding agreement never to discuss this.

(c) Assess Rosa's rights and remedies against The Moon newspaper.

- 5 Nancy, 12 years old, suffered a severe asthma attack at home. Her father, Trevor, called an ambulance and was told that it would be there in a few minutes, but it did not arrive for seven hours. By this time Nancy was in a critical condition. As the ambulance sped to the hospital there was a further delay because of an unrelated accident, which Trevor mistakenly believed involved his son. This caused Trevor to suffer a heart attack.

When the ambulance eventually arrived at the hospital Nancy was treated by a trainee doctor, who misdiagnosed her condition, resulting in Nancy's condition getting worse. A more experienced doctor attempted to save Nancy by administering an experimental drug, which caused Nancy's condition to deteriorate. It was later discovered that the drug was not suitable for those under 16 years of age.

Nancy sustained life-changing injuries and was unable to follow her career as a child actress, estimated to be worth £500,000. She also needed specialist care for life and adaptations made to her family home. Due to Trevor suffering a heart attack in the ambulance he had to give up his £60,000 a year salary for a much lower paid job.

Evaluate Nancy's and Trevor's legal rights and remedies in negligence.
